

Q1 Are you a resident of the Key Peninsula (zip codes 98329, 98349, 98394, 98351)?



Q3 What are your reasons for visiting 360 Trails? Select as many as apply.









Q4 Who joins you when you visit 360 Trails?




Q5 Do you visit any businesses on the Key Peninsula or the surrounding area before or after you visit 360 Trails?


Q6 Do you find 360 Trails to be easily accessible for outdoor recreation?

There were over 300 written responses that supplemented Question 7 from the survey. These responses allowed the public to explain why they chose they agree, disagree, or feel neutrally regarding the potential transfer of ownership of 360 Trails from DNR to Key Pen Parks.

The comments from which the themes below were derived were submitted by members of public and were not changed, regardless of content included.

Themes from the strongly agree and agree comments are:

- 1. Natural land needs to be preserved and protected from clear-cut logging and timber harvests
- 2. Local stewardship and oversight are in the better interest of the public, and Key Pen Parks has first-hand knowledge and experience of managing 360 Trails with the local community's needs as a priority
- 3. Physical health benefits and a local safe area to exercise outdoors
- 4. Mental health benefits and mindfulness practices in nature
- 5. Harvests will compromise the trails and erase the years of work poured into creating and maintaining the trails
- 6. Climate change is combatted by healthy and full forests
- 7. Full of recreational opportunities for groups that have more limited options on the Key Peninsula, such as those of differently abled bodies, mountain bikers, and equestrians
- 8. Trees provide natural buffers between the different types of recreational trails
- 9. A timber harvest would disrupt wildlife and the neighboring communities with the noise and tree removal
- 10. Very little of the money from a timber harvest makes it to schools and other public organizations; it stays in the hands of the timber company
- 11. 360 Trails provide a space for community cultivation
- 12. Educational opportunities offered in the trails

Themes from the neutral comments are:

- 1. Not enough known about the consequences of either result
- 2. Selective logging has its benefits
- 3. Funding sent to schools is good, but clear-cut logging is bad
- 4. Not sure of the urgency of this transfer, as there is no scheduled timber harvest of 360 Trails
- 5. Not an active user of 360 Trails and would feel no impact from either decision

Themes from the strongly disagree and disagree comments:

- 1. Key Pen Parks does not have the current knowledge to solely own and manage this type of land
- 2. The responsibility to maintain this land would be too taxing for such a small community
- 3. Worries, fears, and frustrations of increased taxes
